# Purchases from Unauthorised Resellers may Lead to

## No Automatic Support Available from Cisco

Cisco products purchased from unauthorised resellers may not be automatically eligible for Cisco support. Cisco has a right to inspect the products purchased from unauthorised resellers and, in certain circumstances, to deny support.

#### No Warranty from Cisco

Only new or refurbished Cisco products purchased from an authorised Cisco partner benefit from Cisco warranty.

#### No Valid User License

Cisco products purchased from an unauthorised reseller, may not have a valid software license, in which case, the user would need to purchase a new software license or submit a request and be approved for a license transfer in accordance with Cisco Software Transfer and Relicensing Policy

## Violation of Cisco's Intellectual Property Rights

If a Cisco product was previously sold outside the European Economic Area (EEA) and then illegally imported into the EEA, this is a violation of Cisco Intellectual Property Rights.

# Purchases from Unauthorised Resellers Increase the Possibility of Acquiring

#### **Fake Cisco Products**

A non-genuine device that imitates a Cisco product.

# Cisco Products with Illegally Altered Software, Hardware or Serial Numbers

A Cisco product that has been illegally altered to change the products specification in order to increase its value. Such modifications can cause negative functionality and significantly reduce the reliability.

#### **Stolen Products**

It may be that the Cisco products supplied from the unauthorised resellers have been stolen.

# **Old Products with Obsolete Specifications**

Products offered by unauthorised resellers may be end of life, or end of support.

### **Damaged Products**

Products offered by unauthorised resellers may be damaged. With no warranty from Cisco, there is no possibility for a repair or replacement according to Cisco's service contract policy.

# A product with Reverse Engineered Software (call home issues)

Software of a product bought from unauthorised resellers may be modified and impact functionality and reliability.

We Recommend to Include the BRAND Protection Clause into your Tender Terms and Contracts with CISCO Suppliers

- "The supplier guarantees that any product that they intend to deliver to [customer name]
  - Is new, sourced directly from manufacturer or its authorised resellers
  - Is sold by manufacturer or with its consent within the European Economic Area
  - Is eligible for manufacturer's warranty
  - Is eligible for manufacturer's support services in accordance with manufacturer policies
  - Is accompanied by a valid software license
  - Is reported back to manufacturer as sold to [customer name]

In case any supplied product does not fulfill any of the obligations above, the supplier is in breach of contract with the customer/ buyer. Customer/ buyer reserves the right to check the origin of the supplied products on receipt."
